

TAKE CARE OF YOUR LIVESTOCK IN AN

EMERGENCY

TIPS TO HELP SECURE YOUR LIVESTOCK'S SAFETY IN AN EMERGENCY:

- Remain aware of the risks and hazards in your area.
- Maintain an inventory of the livestock on your ranch.
- Have identification for all livestock (ear tags, tattoos, brands).
- Identify alternate water or power sources.



- Make an evacuation plan to identify routes and safe locations (higher elevation) for your livestock.
- Establish a safe environment for animals.





YOUR LIVESTOCK EMERGENCY GO KIT SHOULD INCLUDE:

OBasic first aid supplies	○ Knife and wire cutters
○7-10 day supply of feed and water	O Duct tape
OWater and feed buckets	○ Flashlight and Radio
Copies of veterinary records and proof of ownership	○ Rope or lariat
	○ Waste clean-up supplies
OHalters and lead ropes	○ Emergency contact list
OPortable livestock panels	○Tarp
OHeavy gloves (leather)	O Hoof knife, nippers and pick
OInstructions for care	○ Map of local area
Diet: record the diet for your animalsMedications: list each animal	\circ
