



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ORDER RELEASING ANIMAL MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS DUE TO NEW WORLD SCREWORM IN LA SALLE AND WEBB COUNTIES

On June 7, 2026, New World Screwworm (NWS) was detected in a bovine in La Salle County. In response, the Executive Director issued the *Executive Director Order Declaring Animal Movement Restrictions Due to New World Screwworm in La Salle and Webb Counties*, establishing Infested Zone 02 and imposing animal movement restrictions within the affected area.

Following a subsequent detection of NWS in La Salle County, the Executive Director issued a modified order on June 9, 2026, expanding the quarantined area and establishing Infested Zone 02.A. The June 9, 2026 order maintained animal movement restrictions within the revised zone to prevent the spread of NWS and support eradication efforts.

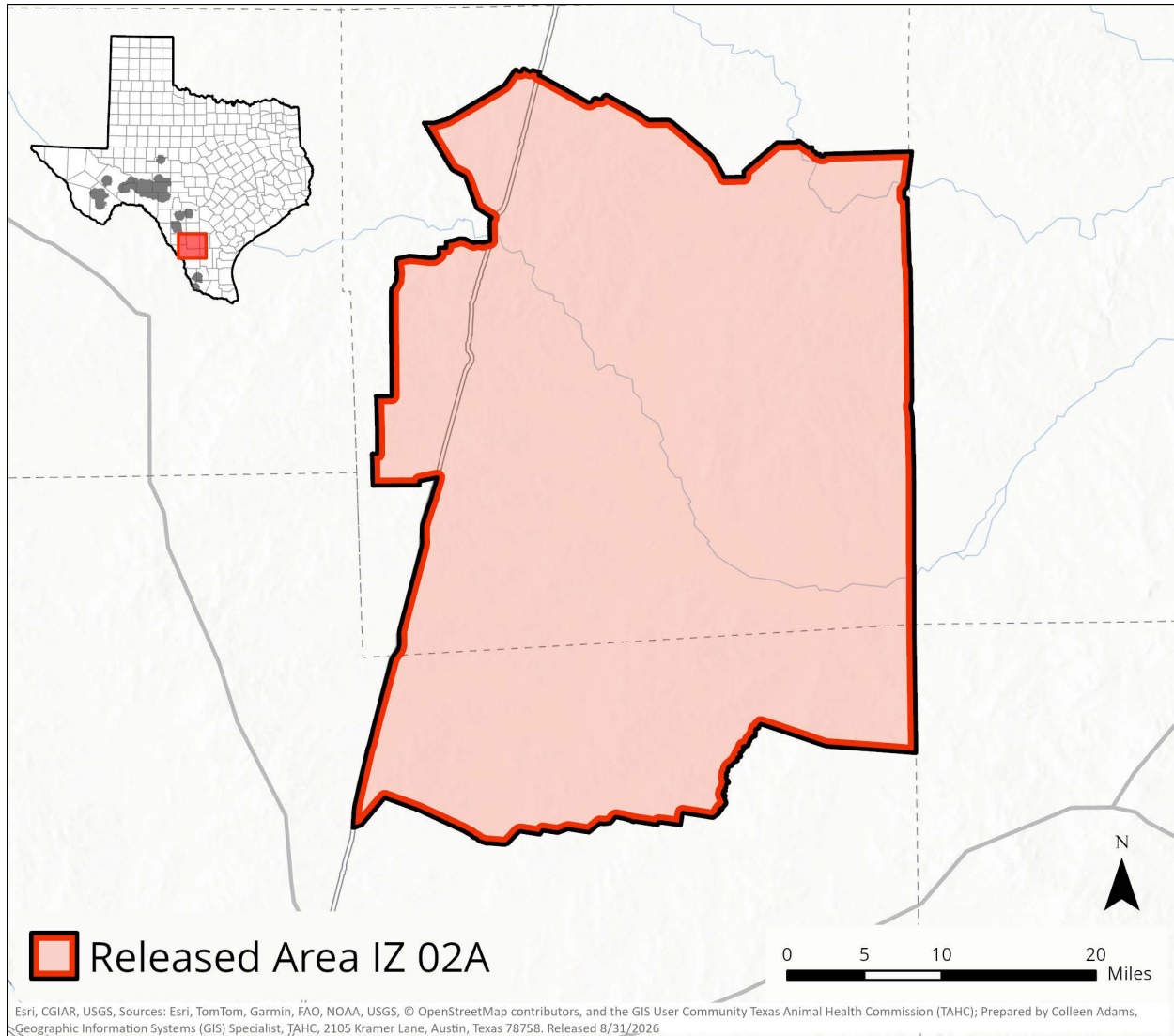
Since issuance of the June 9, 2026 order, Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC), Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), and United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), have worked collaboratively with animal owners, veterinarians, livestock markets, industry organizations, local governments, and other state and federal partners to implement a comprehensive NWS eradication strategy within Infested Zone 02.A.

Sterile NWS flies were released by USDA in and around the affected area to suppress and eliminate any wild NWS population. These sterile fly releases, together with animal inspections, treatment protocols, movement controls, and continued surveillance efforts, have substantially reduced the risk of ongoing NWS infestations.

Based on the epidemiological assessment of Infested Zone 02.A, including fly trapping and monitoring data, assessment of sterile fly dispersal, visual inspection of susceptible animals for myiasis, and the absence of additional NWS detections throughout the surveillance period following the last confirmed detection, the Executive Director finds that sufficient evidence exists to demonstrate that the area identified for release satisfies the criteria for release from quarantine and movement restrictions. The Executive Director further finds that the surveillance conducted following implementation of control and eradication measures has satisfied the criteria necessary for release of the affected area and that the movement restrictions imposed by the June 9, 2026 order have achieved their intended purpose.



Therefore, the following areas of La Salle and Webb Counties are hereby released from the quarantine and movement restrictions imposed by the June 9, 2026 order establishing Infested Zone 02.A:



Although response activities have provided reasonable assurance that the wild NWS population in the affected area has been eliminated, continued vigilance remains essential to prevent the reintroduction or reestablishment of NWS in previously impacted areas. Animal owners and caretakers should continue to monitor animals for wounds and clinical signs consistent with NWS infestation and promptly report any suspected cases to TAHC. Continued surveillance, awareness, and timely reporting are critical to preventing new infestations and protecting animal health in Texas.

This order is issued pursuant to Texas Agriculture Code, Chapters 161 – 168, and
